# The Impact of Sensual Love In 'The God of Small Things' of Arundhati Roy

The Protagonist of this novel Ammu, the mother of a bus born twins faced constantly frustrations and humiliations even at her father's home in Ayemenem. She had developed a love affair with a marginalized low cast carpenter Velutha. Their illegitimate sensual love intimacy broke the societal laws and drew the tragical end of their lives.

Arundhati Roy did her secondary schooling at Lawrence school at Lovedale in the Nilgiris, Tamil Nadu then she moved to Delhi for pursuing architecture where she married Cunha, her classmate. Soon after a bitter married life with him, she divorced him, later she got an introduction with Krishen, a cine maker whom she married at second. She was selected for a scholarship to study Ancient Memorials in Italy while staying in Italy, produced many letters to her husband Krishen that promoted her to a writer.

### II. THE IMPACT OF THE SENSUAL LOVE

In this novel many second generation characters broke the laws for sensual love. At first Chacko comes, the brother of the most humiliated Ammu, owner of Paradise Pickles Factory, after the demise of his Entomologist, hard handed father Pappachi.

After Chacko assumed the charge of manager of that factory, even her mother paid the amount to the women labourers who had gone and come for her son's sensual love as they termed it as men's needs so the factory's one door was specifically kept for this illegal sensual satisfaction. AndAmmu-adeserted divorcee, wife of an alcoholic Assam tea manager Baba, the man who gifted his own wife for his boss sexual seduction to getting back the lost job. Having offered his spouse for his Boss sexual hunger, paveda way for their permanent separation and made themselves into single.

Though he was unwilling to accept her proposal of marrying her, Baby kochamma had been very adamant in making him her life partner for that she had converted into another segment of Christianity. This unsuccessful attempt of tying knots with Father Mulligan and the unreleased prolonged stagnation of sensual feelings of Kochamma turned her as a sadist. And

Chokco married Margaret at Oxford in England, had a daughter but their life became bitter, when Margatet had initiated an affair with a guy called Joe and they got a divorce. So Chacko came back to Ayemenem for spending his rest of life.

"Humans are animals of Habit".

He was said he had many illegal affairs with women before his wedding with Margaret. This sensual hunger of Chacko and Margaret pulled them into polygamy, unfaithful to one another and their lack of care caused the lose of their daughter's life.

Ammu returned as resented by all, as unwelcomed mother of bus born twins after a bitter married life with an alcoholic Baba who exercised the option to win back his job, offered AmmutohisBossMr.Hollick. Inducing his wife for Extra- martial affair is the failure of husband and wife bond.

"Thirty-One Not old Not young But a viable die- able age".

At her 31, - a viable and a die-able age, she had magic secrets in her eyes and went to the river at midnight and swam in it. She was resented and hurted by her ex Nun aunt Baby Kochamma. Kochamma's unquenched sensual love turned her as a sadist and allegedly accused the god of the small things.

During the trip to welcome Sophie Mol to Ayemenem, Rahel and Esthappan were taken to the airport before the day they had gone to Abhilash Talkies, a theater where to watch a movie 'The Sound of Music'. When Esthappan wanted to piss and went to the boys restroom calledMon where an Orange drink Lemonade man mesmerized him and molested him. Thus a look for sensual gratification of Orange drink Lemonade man resulted in Esthappan - more frightened and embarrassed and this incident not only showed middle class people's love on sensuality but also caused him to vomit and had further sleepless nights.

No one respected Ammu in Ayemenem and her head was full of frustrations and anger, longed for love and affections. She was expecting them buthumiliation was the only gift given her.Purposefully Baby Kochamma allegedly

accused Ammu's twin children Rahel and Estha were the main reason of Sophie Mol's death that pushed Ammu in mental agony.

Ammu came back to Ayemenem day by day maximized her pressure so that she did not go out and stayed in her room. When she wanted to relax,herself had begun swimming in the river at midnight. This is the impact of Ammu's ever green sensual love.

"He folded his fear into a perfect rose. He held it out in the palm of his hand. She took it from him and put it in her hair".

Velutha was an outcast carpenter in Paradise Pickles Factory and had been a jack of all trades, particularly a creator of innovative things. This untouchable's home was located on the banks of river. He was the only person who had been speaking affectionately with Ammu. Both Ammu and Velutha died early in the survivable age owing to their passion for sensual love, attracted them to cross social boundaries and are the first prey of sexual thirst.

"She wore flowers in her hair and carried magic secrets in her eyes, she spoke to no one , she smoked cigarettes and had midnight swims".

Both Ammu and Veluthaenjoyed seeing the small creatures and things and sided out for physical gratifications which gave her more pleasures than any other things. So she pleaded with him to enjoy this sensual pleasure everyday. Even when she departed from the river bank, she insisted him that to arrive there "Nalley".

After the demise of Sophie Mol,Rahel and Esthappan were resented and forcibly dispatched from Ayemenem. And their helpless mother had to find a job to meet their needs and their uncle thought Rahel and Esthappan were the reasons for Sophie Mol's boat drowning tragedy. This was the impact of Kochamma's unfulfilled sensual pleasure transformed into false accusations against the twins.

At their 31, Rahel and Estha returned to Grand Pa's home to meet each other, Though their mother reportedly died in a private lodge. When she had gone for a job, died mysteriously, her body was not accepted at the burial ground of a church after that was transported to an electric crematorium, the place where usually unclaimed dead bodies are being cremated. Being died at her 31 and divorced before that, her sensual longings have never died that undying sensual yearnings compelled her to break the love laws and then she could not be a good mother and had to be separated from

### III. CONCLUSION

Roy'sfirst novel 'The God of the Small Things 'clearly picturises the characters who are the scapegoat for the impact of sensual love even knowingly violated the societal laws and brought them dreadful ends. The knowledge of culture and tradition was veiled by the urge of physical gratification. The domination of carnal knowledge of the characters and their attitude of breaking laws for short time sensual delight underlines their physical thirst.

They broke the laws when ever they wished. Many of them are selfish for their individual sensual crave which broke the societal laws purposely and direct the others to join in the chain of victims of this unnatural crime.
